Our young people fired some great scores this year. This is the first year that 3 of our 30 air rifle shooters were able to fire automatic qualification scores. Congratulations to Katie Zaun for her 594-44, Jordyn Ewine for her 584-33, and Casia Steinhaus for her 581-34. Hannah Vaagen with her 572-22 and Sara Bauman with her 570-20 completed the top 5 overall. This was certainly the girls' year.

Wyatt Rollman fired the air rifle match with us again this year. He was able to put up a 531 with 9 centers as our Paralympic competitor. He is an inspiration to all, young and older.

Rachel Vaagen earned first place as a U15 lady with a 557-20, a full 30 points above her score last year.

Garrett Langerud earned the Men's Air Rifle Gold Medal, followed by Jacob Vaagen who earned the Men's Silver, and Kemper Pearson earned the Bronze.

This year, Dylan Zaun won the Gold Medal in Men's Smallbore. Jacob followed to earn the Silver and Garrett Langerud took the Bronze.

The Women's Smallbore Rifle Gold Medal winner is Katie Zaun with an outstanding 587-26. Casia took the Silver with her 572-16 and Jordyn earned the Bronze Medal with her 563-15.

Our air rifle and smallbore participation was actually higher this year than it was last year. 30 young people fired the air rifle matches. 19 fired the smallbore matches. Looking forward to next year, we really hope to see better weather conditions for all of us who travel many miles to compete in this match. Thanks to all of the parents and coaches who made the trip to allow your child the opportunity.

On January 15th, we hosted the North Dakota Junior Olympic Pistol Championships in Devils Lake, ND.

Emily Yoder took the North Dakota Gold Medal in Sport Pistol with her 548-8 to earn an invitation (this is an automatic qualification score). This is also a new junior women's North Dakota State record. She was followed by Kaitlin Slaubaugh who took the Silver with a score of 499-1 and Kyla Slaubaugh who took the Bronze. Isaak Sailer earned the Gold in the Men's Sport Pistol competition.

Kyla Slaubaugh took the Bronze.

Congratulations to each one of you who competed in these matches. Some of the scores fired are just a few points lower than the qualifying scores posted by USA Shooting, and it is quite likely that USA Shooting will issue invitations in the first or second round which will include some of you who did not earn automatic invitations in this match. Whether or not you fired a great score, we hope that each one of you enjoyed a great experience at the match and learned something which will help you to shoot better in the future.
