Pistol 2002 in Review

Our first indoor pistol results come from the January 27, Junior Olympic Selection Match. Christopher Pueppke is the North Dakota State Junior Olympic Air Pistol Champion for 2002, and his score qualified him for the Junior Olympic Nationals in Colorado Springs, CO.

Our indoor Pistol Sectional was held on March 16 and 17 at Fargo, ND. Bill Brackin is our Conventional Champion with a score of 878 by 28. That score earned national placement as 2nd in the High Master class.

Our North Dakota Sectional Standard Pistol Champion is Travis Jorgenson with a score of 566 and he is also the Air Pistol Champion with a score of 565/12X.

Travis' 566 ranked as 3rd place overall in the Standard Pistol national rankings. The National Sectional Champion shot a score of 569 only 3 points higher than Travis' 566.

Connie Jorgenson fired a 545, and this placed her 1st in the ranking for the 2002 National Women's Sectional Air Pistol competition. This is the first time we've had a North Dakota **National Women's Air Pistol Sectional Champion**.

The Sectional Free Pistol Champion was Chris Stover of South Dakota with a score of 523/6X.

Christopher Pueppke placed 1st in the Marksman class for North Dakota. Even more notably, he ranked 1st in the Marksman class for all of those shooters who competed in this Sectional nationally. This is quite an accomplishment for a Junior shooter.

Finally, our North Dakota teams did very well with the Gateway Norskiis placing 3rd in the Free Pistol Sectional Team event. They also placed 3rd in the Standard Pistol Sectional Team event and took 2nd place in the Air Pistol Sectional Team championship. Finally, Bill's Lost Sheep placed 3rd in the Air Pistol Sectional Team, so we had 2nd & 3rd place in Air Pistol nationally.

Following the Sectional, we fired the North Dakota State Pistol Championship in Valley City where Travis Jorgenson is our Air Pistol Champion with a score of 556 with 15X, and he's also our Conventional Indoor Pistol Champion with a score of 869 with 27X.

Jim Ladwig is our Standard Pistol Indoor Champion with a score of 554.

The North Dakota State Air Pistol Team, consisting of Travis- 566, Steve- 564, Bill- 561, James- 546, and Connie-539, with a total of 2776, **won** the National NRA State Postal competition by 25 points over the second place team. We have some very good pistol shooters here in North Dakota.

Steve Faught won our Air Pistol Postal match with a score of 3,350 which is an average of 558.3 for each of the matches. The team of Gram & Gramps otherwise known as Connie & Rick Jorgenson placed 1st in the Air Pistol Team Postal competition.

We then moved into our outdoor season and fired the first outdoor match on June 23 in Bismarck, ND. This was our North Dakota Pistol Regional Championship and Bill Brackin emerged as the winner with a score that he probably doesn't want us to publish. The match was fired in a very strong and gusty wind with the High Master's shooting in the high Sharpshooter and low Expert category because of the wind.

We then traveled to the National Championships in Camp Perry, Ohio. Travis Jorgenson emerged as the High Collegiate in the Aggregate match and he also emerged as the High Collegiate in the National Trophy Individual match where he placed #27 out of 568 competitors.

He was named to the NRA/USA Conventional Pistol Team for the second straight year.

Steve Faught placed #76 in the President's 100 and the rest of us had a lot of fun and even shot some good scores occasionally.

Our North Dakota Pistol Outdoor State Championship was fired on July 28 at Valley City, and Travis Jorgenson fired a 2,621 by 112X to win the State Championship trophy.

Steve Faught fired a 192 by 2X in the Center Fire Slow Fire match for a new North Dakota state record. Steve also set a new state record as the Center Fire Aggregate winner with a score of 876 by 24X.

Travis Jorgenson set a few new records as well. First of all, his Center Fire National Match score of 294 by 15X is a new state record. He also fired a 199 by 16X for the .45 Time Fire State Record and a score of 874 by 43X for the .45 Caliber Aggregate State Record.

Finally, his score of 2,621 by 112X is a new record for the Match Aggregate.

Three North Dakota shooters broke the Conventional Pistol bar of 2600 in 2002 by firing that score or higher in one or more matches this year. These shooters are Bill Brackin, Steve Faught and Travis Jorgenson.

The International Handgun Metallic Silhouette State Championships were held in Dickinson, ND again in 2002 on August 16, 17 & 18.

Travis Jorgenson had a very good match winning the Big Bore 4-gun Aggregate with a score of 143, the Smallbore 4-gun Aggregate with a score of 133 and the Field Pistol Aggregate with a score of 53.

Travis is the North Dakota State Big Bore Unlimited Champion with a perfect score of 40. He is the Big Bore Revolver Champion with a new State Record score of 40. In the Smallbore competition, Travis won the Smallbore Unlimited category with another score of 40 followed by the Smallbore Production category with a score of 39 and the Smallbore Standing category with a score of 25. He also won the Field Pistol Production class with a score of 29.

Rick Jorgenson won the Big Bore Production category with a score of 39, missing a chicken. Rick also won the Smallbore Revolver Championship.

David Hartsoch is our Big Bore Standing Champion with a score of 30, and Dave also won the Big Bore Unlimited Any Sight Championship with a score of 37.

Claire Stoner is our Big Bore Unlimited Standing Champion with a score of 21 and Dave Logosz is our Smallbore Any Sight Champion with a score of 40.

Finally, Brent Cusey is the Smallbore Unlimited Standing Champion with a score of 18 and he is our Field Pistol Any Sight Champion with a score of 31 as well.

We look forward to even better results in 2003, and I hope you can join us in the fun of shooting pistol in North Dakota this year.

RIFLE MATCH RESULTS May 3, 2003

Competitors from Duluth, Minnesota, Vermillion and Rapid City, South Dakota, and Sidney, Montana, joined shooters from around North Dakota to challenge the gusty winds on Saturday, May 3 in the Bismarck/Mandan Rifle and Pistol Association's High Power Rifle Matches. In spite of the weather, Chief Range Officer Sam May of Bismarck did a great job of keeping the matches running smoothly.

Overall winner for the four-stage match was Thomas Thompson of Bismarck with a 746-18X out of a possible 800 aggregate. Tom also prevailed in the 200-yard rapid fire match with 195-4X of a possible 200. Rick Solberg, also of Bismarck, conquered the pesky winds to take the 200-yard slow fire off hand match with 176-1X out of 200. Don Miller of Duluth, Minnesota, stunned the field with a 199-3X out of a possible 200 in the 300-yard prone rapid fire match. At 600 yards slow fire prone, it was all Dennis Coulter of Grand Forks with a 197-9X.

The field of twenty-three competitors included a good turnout of six new shooters, including 15-year old Andrew Costello of Rapid City, South Dakota. He probably had the best time of all the competitors, since he was able to best his uncle, Walt Fairbanks of Bismarck, by almost 100 points on the aggregate.

Sunday morning brought threatening weather, and very early in the Long Range matches the rain came down and did what Saturday's winds could not. The matches were called at midmorning, and all proceeded to enjoy the much welcome moisture.
